SIGN LANGUAGE INTERPRETER LIST

- <u>DANE COUNTY ONLY HIRES:</u> nationally certified or higher skill level interpreters
- Wisconsin law requires all Sign Language Interpreters to be licensed by the State.

PLEASE NOTE:

- At this time there are <u>no independent Sign Language Interpreters</u> working for Dane County government. Therefore, to hire a "Standard" (<u>non legally certified</u>), Sign Language Interpreter <u>please contact "Purple Communications</u> <u>Services," Listed below: (this is a Sign Language Interpreter Scheduling Agency)-</u>
- HOWEVER, when a person has requested a specific sign language interpreter: if you can verify that the interpreter is nationally certified, is licensed by the state, and is not a relative or friend of the person requesting the interpreter, go ahead and hire that interpreter. However, if the interpreter does not meet these qualifications, then use the appropriate interpreter scheduling agency list below.

DEFINITIONS:

- a) <u>"ASL Interpreting" -</u> is largely used by Deaf people whose first language is American Sign Language (ASL).
- **"Transliterating"** is a form of **English language signing** and is used largely by people whose first language is English (i.e. person became deaf later in life, or who were mainstreamed into a regular public school setting).

"NATIONALLY CERTIFIED" interpreter skill level defined:

- 1- R.I.D. NATIONAL CERTIFICATION
 - a- CSC or C1/CT: certified for most situations (both interpreting and transliterating)
 - b- CT or TC: means certified in transliterating, (or English like signing)
 - c- CI or IC: means certified to interpret between ASL and English.
 - d- CLIP and SC:L means special certification for legal interpreting.

2- <u>NAD- NATIONAL CERTIFICATION</u>

a) NAD IV & NAD V are from another national professional rating system.
