DEFINITIONS:

A. <u>Two types of interpreting:</u>

<u>1.</u> "**ASL Interpreting:**" is largely used by Deaf people whose first language is American Sign Language (ASL).

<u>2.</u> "Transliterating:" is a form of English language signing and is used largely by people whose first language is English (i.e. person became deaf later in life, or who were mainstreamed into a regular public school setting).

B. <u>Dane County ONLY hires:</u>

1. "NATIONALLY CERTIFIED" Sign Language Interpreters OR

2. "Nationally certified with a <u>Special Certification for Legal Interpreting.</u>" (For variety of legal situations- sometimes also called: "Legally Certified" Sign Language Interpreters.)

C. DEFINITIONS: <u>"NATIONALLY CERTIFIED:"</u> ANY ONE OF THE FOLLOWING MULTIPLE DESIGNATIONS IS A NATIONAL CERTIFICATION:

NIC

CSC or **C1/CT**: certified for most situations (both interpreting and transliterating) **CT** or **TC**: means certified in transliterating, (or English like signing) **CI** or **IC**: means certified to interpret between ASL and English. CLIP and **SC:L** means special certification for legal interpreting.

"NAD" NATIONAL CERTIFICATION:

• NAD IV & NAD V are national certifications from a different rating system.



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D. CODE OF ETHICS

All Sign Language interpreters on the Dane County Sign Language Interpreter list have agreed to the following:

Code of Ethics: for the Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf (R.I.D.)

The Code of Ethics is:

- Keeping all assignment-related information strictly confidential
- Rendering the message faithfully
- Not counseling, advising or interjecting personal opinions
- Accepting assignments with discretion with regard to skill, setting and consumers
- Requesting compensation in a professional manner
- Functioning appropriately to each individual situation
- Striving to further knowledge and skills
